	<p><b>Speaker: Andrew Mills, Director, Tax Policy and Technical, The Tax Institute of Australia</b></p> <p>Andrew currently undertakes a number of roles in the tax profession - Director of Tax Policy &amp; Technical at The Tax Institute, a Senior Fellow at Melbourne University Law School, a member of the Australian Executive Committee of the International Fiscal Association and a member of the Tax and Transfer Policy Institute Advisory Board.</p> <p>Andrew was Second Commissioner of Taxation from 2013 - 2019 where he had overall responsibility for the ATO's law practice, including law interpretation, dispute prevention and resolution, and the ATO's role in policy and law design.</p> <p>Prior to his time as Second Commissioner, Andrew was a Director at Greenwoods &amp; Freehills for more than 20 years and Managing Director of the firm from 2006 to 2011. Andrew is a former Governor of the Taxation Research Foundation. He has also spent time as an in-house corporate advisor, involved in Treasury and ATO engagement on behalf of industry bodies, as well as in a range of roles in the ATO in the 1980s.</p>
